
The WAY Youth Movement

Mary Hill Davis Offering

September is the month we take up the Mary Hill Davis offering which supports missions work in Texas. Mary Hill Davis was born in Greenville, Georgia, and came to Texas as a small child in 1870. Mary's heart for missions and people was evident in everything she did. She believed Texas was a vast mission field, and that immigrants needed to know Jesus just as much as citizens.

Mary was elected president of the Texas Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) in 1906 and served for the next twenty-five years. She died in 1934. The following year the Texas Woman's Missionary Union named the annual offering for state missions the Mary Hill Davis Offering in honor of the woman who led Texas Baptist women to pray and give to Texas missions' efforts.

The following quote from Mary Hill Davis in 1923 is still applicable today.

"It seems fitting in this time of world chaos and untoward tendencies that we should call ourselves back to a new sense of loyalty to our cause. The feeling of unrest in social and political and religious life was never quite so sinister nor so aggressive as it is today. If there ever was a time when Christian hearts should call themselves back to a sense of loyalty to God and our organized work, that time is now upon us."

Mary Hill Davis encouraged Baptists to support missions both spiritually and financially. Today, your prayers and gifts to the Mary Hill Davis Offering continue to support missionaries and opportunities for people to hear the Gospel and find hope in Christ. The offering is a vital part of this work—100 percent of the money collected goes directly to sending missionaries, supporting missions in Texas, and sustaining the ministry efforts of the WMU of Texas. You are encouraged to pray about your participation in the Mary Hill Davis offering.
